Initial screening

The assessment process will remain open throughout the duration of the play review and will be refreshed in parallel with key decision making points in the process.

Though play is enjoyed by people of all ages, fixed play facilities are of higher value to children and young people, and particularly those that are disabled. These groups are protected through the Council Equalities Duty and consultation considering appropriate 'levels of provision' should capture their views.

It is recognised that any redistribution of fixed play sites may have a disproportionate impact on children, parents and guardians as they may have to travel further to access fixed play provision than previously and may have limited access to a car or public transport. The increased costs associated with accessing services incurred through transport may disproportionately affect these groups.

Residents from the same groups in areas prioritised to have increased access to fixed play provision in the future will have improved access to these facilities.
