#### **Purpose of the Report**

To request that delegated authority to award the Digital Durham contract for the provision of superfast broadband is granted to the Corporate Director Resources in conjunction with the Portfolio Holder Resources.

#### **Background**

- Durham County Council, in partnership with Gateshead, Sunderland and the five Tees Valley authorities has started a procurement process to procure an infrastructure delivery partner to provide businesses, homes and communities across the programme areas with much improved broadband services.
- The programme will provide all areas in County Durham with access to fast speed broadband within the next 5 years and will enhance business opportunities, improve educational activity and the quality of peoples' lives generally.

#### **Current Position**

- Following a public consultation exercise during November 2012, the programme issued an Invitation to Tender (ITT) on 19 December 2012 which will allow the programme to meet the Government's Broadband Delivery UK's (BDUK) assurance process and be ready to contract on 1 April 2013.
- Adherence to the timeline detailed above would lead to contract award to the successful bidder by mid-April 2013, which will be during the purdah period due to the election of Durham County Council members on 3 May 2013.
- To avoid the risk of further delay to the programme and the possibility of losing the slot in the BDUK release schedule, it is requested that delegated authority to award the contract is granted.

#### Recommendation

7 Cabinet is requested to agree that delegated authority to award the Digital Durham contract is granted to the Corporate Director Resources in consultation with the Portfolio Holder Resources.
