Consideration of a Temporary Event Notice

1. Summary

The Sub-Committee is asked to consider an objection notice served by the Chief Inspector of Durham Constabulary in response to a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) under Part 5 of the Licensing Act 2003 relating to:

Red Velvet 29 Front Street Consett County Durham DH8 5AB

Officers are unable to determine this matter due to an objection notice being received from the Chief Inspector on the basis that the event will undermine all of the four licensing objectives, namely the Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety, the Prevention of Public Nuisance, Protection of Children from Harm.

2. Details of the Notice

On 11th June 2012, the premises user, David Bartley served a temporary event notice for Red Velvet, 29 Front Street, Consett. A copy of this notice is attached as Appendix 1.
