Work Programme 2016/17 - Update

Purpose of the Report

To provide Members with an update on the Panel's work programme for 2016/17.

Detail

- 2. At its meeting on 19 July 2016, the Panel considered a report detailing its work programme for 2016/17 and requested that arrangements be made for a development session to be held within the year, an agenda item on road safety to be included and for one of the Panel's meetings to be held in Darlington. The following provides an update to actions from this meeting.
- 3. The Panel's development session is to be held on Tuesday 22 November 2016 at Durham Police Headquarters, starting at 12:00 noon. The focus of the development session is to appraise Members on activity of the Local Criminal Justice Board (LCJB) and review work undertaken by the Commissioner's Office. The session will also include a presentation on the history of Durham Constabulary and a tour of the control room at headquarters. Further details and an information pack will be issued to all Panel Members in advance of the development session.
- 4. Appendix 2 contains an updated work programme for 2016/17 and has been updated to include an item on road safety on 2 February 2017 and that the Panel's meeting on 10 March 2017 will be held at the Town Hall in Darlington.
- 5. To deliver the Panel's work programme and associated activity, financial support is provided by grant funding of up to £64,340 for administration and members expenses is available to be claimed from the Home Office by the Host Authority. It is to note that Panel expenditure in 2015/16 was £82,670 with £64,340 recovered from the central government grant and the variance met by the Host Authority.
