The proposed extensions and alterations by reason of their size and position would result in a loss of amenity and privacy for the occupiers of no. 23 Whitwell Acres and as a result the proposal is considered to be contrary to the requirements of Policy Q9 of the City of Durham Local Plan 2004.

(c) 07/00652/PNT Highway verge north of West View, Meadowfield, O2 UK Limited Durham Erection of 12.5 metre high telecommunications pole

Resolved: That the application be **REFUSED** for the following reasons:-

It is considered that the proposed mast by virtue of its siting and appearance would be visually obtrusive and detrimental to the visual amenity of the area and therefore conflict with Policy U1 of the City of Durham Local Plan 2004.

181. TREE PRESERVATION ORDER PN1/400 23 DRYBURN ROAD

This Tree Preservation Order was served on 1st March, 2007. The Order was made to protect 2 no. Birch trees considered to be under treat due to development pressure following

a change in ownership. The trees were located in a prominent location adjacent to Aykley Heads roundabout. The trees were of local visual importance and contributed to the character of the local area.

The level of threat was considered to be medium; there was local concern that the trees were going to be removed.

No objections had been received to the Order, and two anonymous telephone calls had been received in support.

Confirmation of the Tree Preservation Order would safeguard the tree's contribution to local visual amenity in lieu of the Inspector's decision on the TPO appeal.

Resolved: That Tree Preservation Order PN1/400, 23 Dryburn Road, Durham be confirmed without modification.
