Licensing Act 2003 – Appointment of Statutory Licensing Sub Committee

Purpose of the Report

1. To formally appointment the Statutory Licensing Sub Committee in accordance with Sections 9 and 10 of the Licensing Act 2003.

Background

2. The Licensing Act 2003 confers on the new Unitary Authority the duty of becoming the 'Licensing Authority' for Alcohol, Regulated Entertainment and Late Night Refreshment licensing purposes. Section 6 of the Licensing Act 2003 prescribes a minimum membership of the Statutory Licensing Committee of 10, and a maximum of 15, as a legislative requirement. The County Council's Constitution approved on 17th March prescribes that the membership of this Committee should be the maximum number of 15.

3. Section 9 of the Licensing Act 2003 prescribes that the Licensing Authority may establish one or more 'Sub Committees', consisting of no more than 3 members of the Statutory Licensing Committee to carry out its duties. Section 10 allows the Statutory Licensing Committee to discharge any functions of the Licensing Authority in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003, except for the determination of Policy, to:

a) a Sub-Committee / Panel, established by it; or

b) an officer of the Licensing Authority.

4. The County Council on 17th March, as part of its Constitutional arrangements, agreed that a Statutory Licensing Sub Committee be established to discharge all of the functions of the parent Statutory Licensing Committee, except policy development and matters delegated to officers. The functions of the Statutory Licensing Committee are attached at Appendix 1.

5. The Sub-Committee would be made up of 3 Members of the Statutory Licensing Committee appointed by the Head of Legal and Democratic Services on a rota basis. In accordance with Best practice a 4th Member would be invited to attend, and held in reserve, as sometimes a Member cannot sit due to unavailability, illness or finds they need to make a declaration of interest. Rather than cancel a Hearing, it is considered prudent to have 4 Members in attendance hearing the evidence, but only 3 would retire to make their deliberations.

Recommendation

6. The Committee are asked to approve the Sub Committee arrangements as detailed above.
