Subject:	Amendment to the Constitution and Powers of the Standards Committee

The purpose of the report is to obtain Council approval to amend Article 9 of the Constitution and Paragraph 23 of the Council Procedure Rules in the form of the annexed Appendix.

#### Consultation

Prior to preparing this report, all Councillors and Members of the Standards Committee have been consulted on the changes proposed by DCLG rendering these amendments necessary.

#### Background

DCLG have consulted on their intention to transfer responsibility for receipt, investigation and determination of complaints from the Standards Board for England to Local Standards Committees. The more serious cases will continue to be referred to the Adjudication Panel for England but all complaints will, from a date to be specified, be referred to the Local Standards Committee rather than the Standards Board. The original intention had been to implement these changes with effect from 1 April 2008 but regulations require Parliamentary approval before that process can be completed and it is understood that the changes will not be made until after the May 2008 Elections at the earliest.

The purpose of this report is to identify the changes which need to be made to enable the Council to operate the new arrangements and to obtain Council approval to those changes. The workload of the Standards Committee will be increased. Members who participated in the original decision not to investigate a complaint will not be permitted to participate if the complainant requests that decision be reviewed. The Committee must from 1 April 2008, be chaired by an independent representative and it will be best practice to have an independent chair of each of the Sub-Committees hearing complaints at their various stages. Any complaint against a Parish Councillor must involve at least one Parish Member on the Sub-Committee. It is therefore no longer sufficient to have two Independent and Parish Members and steps are being taken to recruit an additional Independent and Parish Member as identified in the consultation documents circulated to Members previously. In order to maintain the original balance of the Committee and in order to ensure availability of sufficient Members to form Sub-Committees if there is an increase in business it is recommended that Council representation on the Standards Committee be increased to six when the Council holds it Annual Meeting next month.
