







CP EAMPC 2.1	We will publicise positive activities including youth work, sport and recreation, cinema and theatre projects, IT and music opportunities through the getoutthere.info website, which is the young person's activity directory for County Durham. CP EAMPC 2.2	On behalf of the Department for Children Schools & Families, we will deliver the Empowering Young People Pilot countywide. This will test if giving disadvantaged young people spending power increases participation in positive activities				Active recruitment to the pilot has now ended and the focus is on maximising young people's spend. The spend rate is now above 40%.	
CP EAMPC 2.3	We will develop a programme of heritage and cultural activities for teenagers. These activities will be based on the identified needs of teenagers. We plan 10 events by the end of September 2008 and a further 10 by the end of March 2009				18 events have taken place with teenagers between April and December 2008 working in partnership with Looked After Children's Service and a further 4 delivered through the BRASS, Durham international Festival. An additional 8 activities will be delivered through 'Digital Life Stories' by the end of January 2009. 'Digital Life Stories' are created by Looked After Children using film and sound, and are put onto a website - the stories reflect the path that the children's lives have taken. Further activities will take place in the Easter school holidays. Including the Alcohol Free Music Event tour which will take place in a range of venues around the County.	
CP EAMPC 2.4	We will increase the number of teenagers benefiting from the Youth Opportunity and Capital Funds. Young people will be making the decisions as to how the money from the Youth Opportunity and Capital Funds will be allocated.				The funds are now 95% allocated and evaluation sessions have been undertaken with youth workers fund support workers and the voluntary sector.
