
Environment Scrutiny Sub-Committee 17th September 2007 Q1 2007/08 Performance



Report of the Head of Corporate Policy

- 1. The purpose of this report is to provide an update of quarter 1 performance for the authority's priorities and the Best Value Performance Indicators (BVPIs) relevant to our Corporate Aim, Looking after the Environment.
- 2. To gain maximum impact of performance management intelligence from Performance Plus, the Authority's performance management system, tolerances and milestones have been set for 2007/08 targets.



3. Performance and comments relating to indicators relevant to the Corporate Aim, Looking after the Environment are reported in Appendix A. An overview of performance is as follows;

Waste

Minimisation campaigns and the permit scheme have contributed to a decrease in the amount of waste per head of population. The existing 2 towers of the digester facility have been out of operation for some of the time affecting both the recycling and composting rates. The construction of a third tower is now complete and is being tested. All three towers should be online soon. The third tower is anticipated to bring about a 3.5 percentage point increase to the recycling / composting rates. Waste tyres are now recycled. At this point it is expected that year-end targets will be achieved.

The sample survey for BV178 is a 5% random survey of the network carried out in 2 surveys in May and November. Analysis of the results does not indicate a particular problem area and a combination of factors is believed to have contributed to the result, i.e. small sample for our network of over 3000km, entirely random, the unseasonable conditions of the spring and early summer, staffing and budgetary constraints. An action plan for BV178 is in place and we expect the November survey to be an improvement on the May survey. However, it is unlikely that the 2007/08 target will be achieved and the year-end prediction has been reviewed to 70%.

- 6. Year-end predictions suggest that all indicators will meet their year-end targets except BV 178, % of the total length of rights of way in the local authority area that are easy to use by the general public. See paragraph 5 for further details.
