Purpose of the Report

To consider a request for temporary traffic regulation by Order on 19 April 2019 for the purpose of preventing obstruction of the highway during the Chester-le-Street Walk of Witness Good Friday Procession.

Background

Chester-le-Street Churches Together proposed to undertake a Good Friday procession on Ropery Lane and Front Street, Chester-le-Street within the confines of the highway between 11.00 and 11.30 am.

Options

Other traffic management arrangements have been considered and the most appropriate method is for short term road closure

The recommendation is approved and that following, consultations with the Chief of Police, arrangements be made to progress the sealing of an Order.
