To consider a request for temporary traffic regulation by Order on 15 June 2019 for the purpose of preventing obstruction when the streets are liable to be thronged during the holding of the Cotherstone Carnival procession on B6277.

Background

The annual Cotherstone Carnival procession is proposed to be undertaken on Saturday 15 June 2019 between 1.05 and 1.25 pm within the confines of the highway.

Other traffic management arrangements have been considered and the most appropriate method is for temporary closure.
