Purpose of the Report

To consider a request for temporary traffic regulation by Order on Saturday 3 August 2019 for the purpose of preventing obstruction when the streets are liable to be thronged owing to the holding of the annual Middleton in Teesdale Carnival Parade, phased between noon and 1.30pm.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Council exercises its powers under the Town Police Clauses Act 1847 to effect a Temporary Traffic Regulation Order to facilitate the proposed event

Background

The annual carnival parade is proposed to be undertaken within the confines of the highway between Ellots and Leekworth Lane/Gardens via B6277 Alston Road and B6282 Horsemarket, Middleton in Teesdale.

Options

Other traffic management arrangements have been considered and the most appropriate method is for short term road closure

Recommendation

The recommendation is approved and that following, consultations with the Chief of Police, arrangements be made to progress the sealing of an Order.

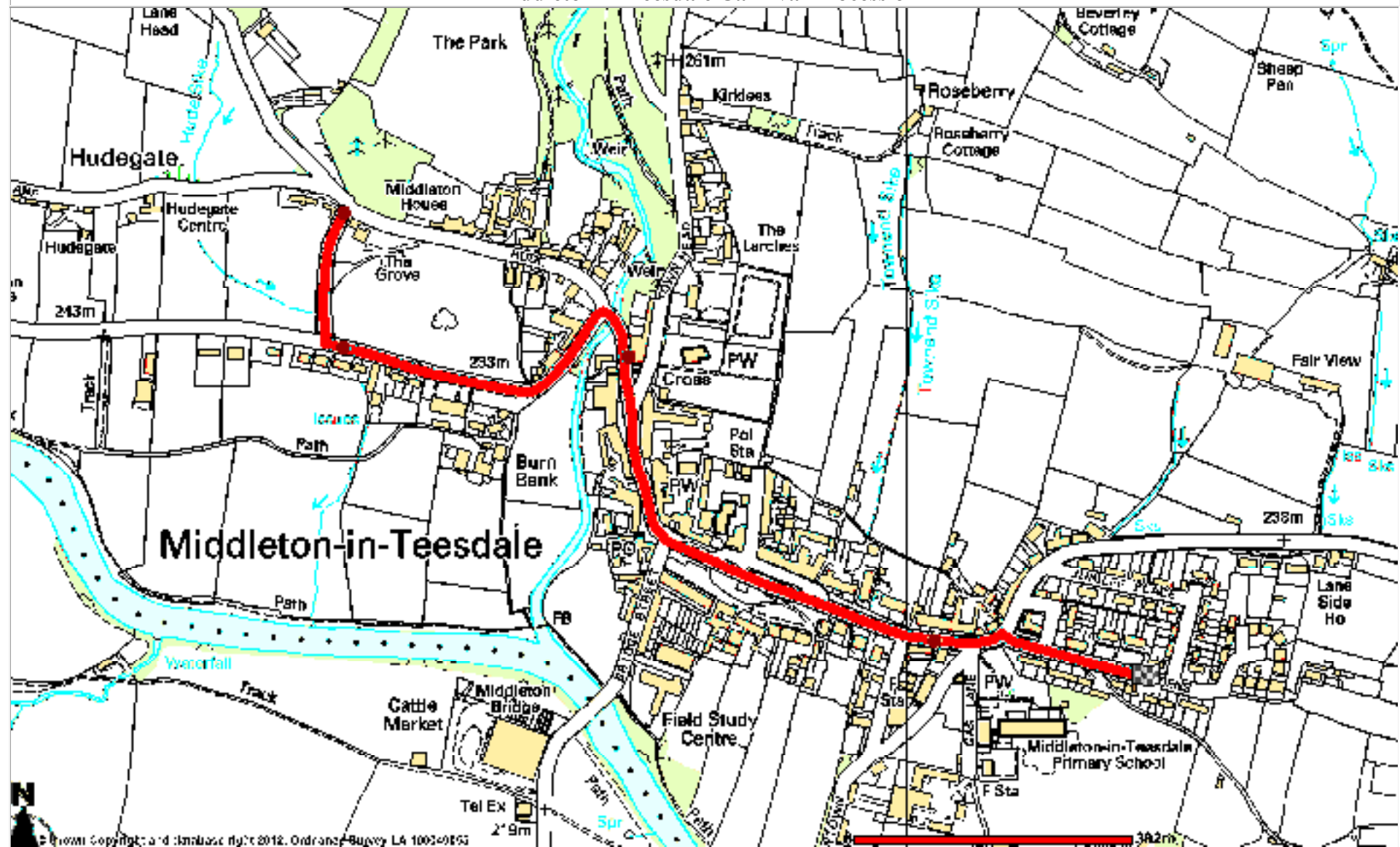
