Quarterly Performance Report

The Panel received a report on quarterly performance from the Police, Crime and Victims' Commissioner. The report provided Members with performance information on two outcomes from PCVC's Plan relating to 'Reoffending is reduced and rehabilitation is improved' and 'People have confidence in the police and criminal justice system'.

Police and Crime Panel Work Programme

- The work programme enables the Panel to plan how it will effectively provide challenge to the PCVC and deliver its responsibilities within the context of its terms of reference and rules of procedure and the Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act. The programme includes details of Panel meetings for 2019/20.
- The Panel agreed the work programme report and requested that arrangements be also made to hold a development session in 2019/20.

HMICFRS Integrated Performance Assessment report

- The HMIC FRS report provided findings of the Integrated Performance Assessment (IPA) of Durham Constabulary by HMICFRS. In 2018/19 HMICFRS adopted an IPA approach to their PEEL inspections, combining the effectiveness, efficiency and legitimacy areas into a single inspection.
- The findings from the IPA reported that Durham Constabulary retained its overall 'Outstanding' grades for Effectiveness and Efficiency and 'Good' for Legitimacy.

Commissioning Update and PCVC Decision records

The panel received reports providing a summary of Commissioning Board meetings held in March and April 2019 and the PCVC's decision records that have been undertaken since the panel's previous meeting.
