I CLAUD SNUSHALL of the Rectory Romaldkirk in the North Riding of the County of York Mester of Arts Clerk in Hely Orders, Lord of the Manor of Romaldkirk send greeting:-

1. WHEREAS "Romaldkirk Town Street" in the Parish of Romaldkirk is parcel of the waste of the Manor of Romaldkirk and is commonly known as "The Village Green"

AND WHEREAS the same is subject to the rights of the villagers to common of pasture and to other similar rights

AND WHEREAS it is desirable that the public should subject to the rights of the villagers have access to the said premises AND WHEREAS I the said Lord of the Manor am desirous of dedicating the said premises to the public subject to the aforesaid rights of the villagers

NOW THEREFORE I the said Claud Smushall as Lord of the said Manor of Romaldkirk hereby declare

- 1. That Section 193 of the Law of Property Act 1925 shall apply to the said Remaldkirk Town Street so far as the same is parcel of the wastes of the said Manor
- 2. That this deed shall be at any time revecable by the Lord of the said Manor for the time being by deed deposited with the Ministry of Agriculture and Pisheries
