

# Chronology of Events and Actions Taken at West Lane Hospital November 2018 to October 2019

County Durham CYP OSC 14<sup>th</sup> October 2019

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- 16 November 2018 Allegations of inappropriate moving and handling of patients at Westwood, WLH
  - Referral to police no criminal case to answer
  - Referral to Safeguarding LADO process instigated
- Staff suspended pending investigation of allegations
- Enhanced surveillance commenced by NHSE
  - Quality Assurance Plan agreed for the area
  - Finance secured for enhanced NYAS contract
  - Recruitment of additional staff
- Staff deployed to enhance site staffing levels
  - Including Recovery Lead / Modern Matron
  - Recruitment of additional staff / additional management oversight

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- Training and subsequent return to work programme for some staff who observed incidents
- Commencement of NHSI Reducing Restrictive Practice
   National Pilot January 2019
- March 2019 Disciplinary outcomes progress and some staff start to return to work

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- 1st March: formal notification from NHSE that Westwood could reopen to admissions
  - Assured that day to day staffing and management levels were stable
  - Weekly surveillance meetings stepped down with continued enhanced surveillance
- 5<sup>th</sup> April 2019 NHSE site visit: Alison Cannon, Regional Mental Health Lead, and Lesley Patel, Regional Director of Nursing for Specialised Commissioning
- 29 April 2019: British Institute for Human Rights pilot study

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- April May 2019 Return of remaining staff suspended following conclusion of disciplinary processes
- May 2019 Staffing issues due to staff sickness
- June 2019: Clinical acuity increasing across site
- June 2019: CQC Thematic Review of Restraint Seclusion and Segregation

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- 20<sup>th</sup> June 2019: CQC Inspection of C&YPS (including all wards at WLH, Baysdale and Holly Unit)
- 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2019: Inpatient serious incident
- 25<sup>th</sup> June 2019: CQC Enforcement Action. Urgent Notice of Decision to Impose Conditions on the registration of the Trust as a service provider (Section 31 of the Health & Social Care Act)
  - Additional managerial and operational staff deployed to support staffing (B7 Site Co-ordinators and additional managerial on call for the site)
  - West Lane site closed to admissions

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- July 2019: Sickness increases and daily calls/ Interim continuity arrangements put in place
  - Enhanced staff wellbeing arrangements put in place
- 11<sup>th</sup> July 2019: Emergency Business Continuity Plans invoked
  - Internal business continuity arrangements
  - Opel Level 3 (due to significant increase in sickness absence levels)
- 15<sup>th</sup> July 2019: Wards amalgamated at West Lane Hospital
  - Patients from Newberry transferred to Westwood and Evergreen

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- End July: Additional staffing challenges ongoing safeguarding investigations
- 31 July: Staff member died
- 1 August: NHS E/I visit to WLH (focus on Westwood)
- 5 August: Inpatient Serious Incident (young person died at JCUH 8/8)

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- 6 August: CQC responsive inspection of WLH
- 20 21 August: CQC Service Inspection
- 21 August: CQC core service inspection published services rated as inadequate
- 23 August Notification received of closure
- August September 2018 Liaison with NHSE to arrange appropriate transfer / discharge of remaining young people

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- 17 September 2019 Last young person transferred from West Lane
- Sept October 2019: Staffing Implications
  - Some staff retained to support delivery of care packages
  - Remaining staff temporarily moved to new service areas including focus on supporting enhanced home treatment
  - Reconnection events planned

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#### **Interim Access to Beds**

- West Lane Hospital has been closed to admissions since June 25<sup>th</sup>
- Core Group of Senior Staff retained at site to facilitate bed management process
  - Interface with NHS E to support access to beds
  - Liaison with external providers and community teams to support communication and minimise length of stay as appropriate
  - NHS E actively reviewing regional bed capacity
