Purpose of the Report

- 1 To consider changes to the Public Rights of Way network.
- Public Bridleways Nos. 38 Shadforth Parish and 5 Sherburn Parish, proposed Diversion and Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order, and Public Footpaths Nos. 42 Shadforth Parish and 33 Sherburn Parish, proposed Diversion and Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order.

Executive summary

- To enable development in accordance with planning permission granted 20 November 2019, namely the extension of timber storage facilities at Taylormade Timber, Sherburn Hill, it is necessary to divert Public Bridleways Nos. 38 Shadforth Parish and 5 Sherburn Parish, and as a consequence to divert part of Public Footpath No. 42 Shadforth Parish and extend Public Footpath No. 33 Sherburn Parish.
- 4 Consultations on the proposed diversions have been carried out and no objections have been received.

Recommendation

- The proposal is in accordance with the Council's policy and the statutory framework on the diversion of public rights of way.
- 6 It is RECOMMENDED that a Diversion and Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order be made under the provisions of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 and the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 to divert Public Bridleways Nos. 38 Shadforth Parish and 5 Sherburn Parish to enable development to proceed in accordance with planning permission, and that a Diversion and Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order be made under the provisions of the Highways Act 1980 and the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 to divert Public Footpath No. 42 Shadforth Parish and extend Public Footpath No. 33 Sherburn Parish in the interests of the landowner, and the Orders shall subsequently be either confirmed or referred to the Secretary of State for determination, and that the Corporate Director of Resources be informed accordingly, as per paragraph 70 of the Constitution of the County Council.

Background

- An application has been received on behalf of Taylormade Timber of Sherburn Hill to divert Public Bridleways Nos. 38 Shadforth and 5 Sherburn, to enable the extension of timber storage facilities, for which planning permission has been granted, as shown on the attached plan. A consequence of the bridleway diversion is that part of Public Footpath No. 42 Shadforth also needs to be diverted, thereby extending Public Footpath No. 33 Sherburn.
- Bridleway No. 38/5 runs in a generally northerly direction from Kell Crescent at Sherburn Hill, past Taylormade Timber to Cookshold Lane, and will therefore be affected by the proposed development, which cannot proceed without the diversion of the Public Bridleway. The Order is therefore necessary to enable development to proceed in accordance with planning permission. The second plan attached shows the proposed development.
- The proposal is to divert the section of Bridleway No. 38/5 which runs north across the development site, onto a more westerly route, around the south and west of the site, partly upgrading the current Public Footpath No. 42 Shadforth and requiring a diversion of a small additional part of that footpath, adding to the length of Public Footpath No. 33 Sherburn.
- 10 Consultations have been carried out with the Local Members, the Cabinet Portfolio Holder, adjoining landowners, the Ramblers' Association, the British Horse Society and other user groups. No objections have been received.

Options

This is the minimum diversion possible to enable the development to proceed. The proposal retains and protects public access at this location.

Conclusion

12 Agreed to the Diversion Orders in accordance with the Recommendation.
