## **Purpose of the Report**

To consider a request for a temporary traffic regulation by Order on 19<sup>th</sup> August, 2020 for the purpose of actioning repair/maintenance works to the electrical sub-station on Adventure Lane, West Rainton.

# **Executive summary**

The request is considered essential works for the benefit of the local community.

#### Recommendation

It is recommended that the Council exercises its powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 to effect a Temporary Traffic Regulation Order to facilitate the proposed works.

# **Background**

- O' Connor Utilities Limited are to undertake the works and advise nearby residences and the Traveller Site of the temporary road closure order. Signage will also be erected prior to commencement of the works, which will alert nearby road users of the approaching road closure.
- 5 Consultations have been carried out with the local members, the portfolio holder, the Chief of Police, Fire and Rescue Service and the Ambulance service.
- The Road Closure order will allow the necessary works to be carried out safely.

7 The unadopted road is not on a bus route and does not form part of a Public Right of Way.

## **Options**

Alternative traffic management arrangements have been considered and the most appropriate method is for the temporary road closure, over a period of 10 days.

## **Main implications**

Whilst the temporary road closure is in operation, access will still be available as and when required to Adventure Lane Traveller site. Therefore it is recommended that the closure is approved to facilitate the necessary works.
