Consultation letter sent to all respondents

Consultation – Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 Proposed Amendment to the Definitive Map of Public Rights of Way at Middlestone (Ref: 7/18/024)

An application was received by us in 2018 for a Definitive Map Modification Order from a Mrs S. Gamble to record a lane located in Middlestone formerly known as Nanny Poes Lane (or Leasingthorne Lane) as a Bridle Way (Please see attached plan). There is sufficient historic evidence that suggest the order would likely be approved. To clarify, a Bridleway is open to pedestrians, horses and pedal cyclists only.

Under provisions of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 the Council has a duty to keep the Definitive Map and Statement under continuous review and make appropriate modifications by order.

I am currently seeking the your views as well as the Town Council, Landowners, and other user organisations (Open Spaces Society and Sustrans Uk etc) and will be pleased to include any comments you may wish to offer regarding the proposed modification to the Highways Committee. A draft report will be composed and will incorporate any views, objections and additional evidence submitted by those in receipt of this consultation.

It is likely that the Highways Committee will not review the claim mentioned above until August /September 2021. However, it would be appreciated that you submit your views, objections or additional evidence within 30 days of receipt of this mail or inform me if you would like more time to consider this matter.

Please note that if you do make representations, then by virtue of the Local Government (Access to Information) Act 1985, the County Council must make these publicly available when a report on this application is considered by the Committee.


