# Place

- Senior Environmental Health Officer and 3 Community Protection Officers
- Key partners include Wardens, Housing Officers, Police and Fire & Rescue teams
- Five multi-agency Neighbourhood Resolution Plans in place to tackle local problems around ASB, waste vermin and secondary fires, blight properties and other housing issues
- Multi agency Tri-responders (Council, Fire and Police) initiative in development

# Partnerships for People and Place

Recently awarded 100k funding as part of Government's PfPP programme over next 2 years.

'Theory of Change' exercise underway with workshops around Community; Places; People and our Strategy.

Participatory budget setting to deliver theory of change around 4 key outcomes:-

- 'Improved understanding of crime, ASB and safeguarding to better inform practice'
