Introduction

- 1. The Publication Draft Minerals and Waste Policies and Allocations Document (Publication Draft M&WDPD) was consulted upon under Regulation 19 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012 between 28 November 2022 and 13 January 2023. All representations made have been reviewed and carefully considered and it has been concluded that, subject to some minor text and formatting changes which need to be made (including updating chapter 1 of the M&WDPD to reflect that consultation under Regulation 19 has now been completed) that there are no matters arising from the representations that call into question the soundness of the Publication Draft M&WDPD or the legality of its preparation that would prevent it being submitted to the Minister for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities in its current form.
- 2. Following consideration of the consultation comments, a schedule of minor (additional) modifications to the Publication Draft M&WDPD are proposed. These modifications do not alter the meaning or substance of the Publication Draft M&WDPD and do not trigger the need for further assessment either by the Sustainability Appraisal or Habitats Regulations Assessment.
- 3. Notwithstanding this position, and in the interest of good practice, where necessary it is proposed that officers continue to discuss issues raised during the consultation period with stakeholders in the run up to the Examination, to further minimise their areas of concern.
- 4. The Inspector, in examining the Plan and in light of representations made, may conclude that main or further minor (additional) modifications are required to make it sound and capable of adoption. Any 'main modifications' made in relation to soundness will need to be the subject of further consultation. The council has authorised the Corporate Director of Regeneration to ask the Inspector under section 20(7C) of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 to recommend modifications to the Plan, to ensure that modification, if required, can be made to satisfy the requirements of subsection (5)(a) and make the document sound.
