

Location 1 – Boddy Street – Proposals Locations










Vehicles parked on the northern side of the A689 restrict access for school service coaches.

School service coaches require immediate access for safe boarding/alighting of passengers.






Location 2 – King James – Proposals Locations

Proposed extension of existing 'no waiting at any time' restrictions (double yellow lines) will prevent obstructive parking and improve adjacent to school.

'No waiting at any time' restrictions (double yellow lines) will allow a safe passing place for opposing vehicles to maintain Traffic Flow via the A689 South Church Road.

Proposed extension of existing 'No Stopping' restrictions ('school keep clear' markings) will improve access/egress & visibility around school entrance.





Proposed coach bays will reserve access in suitable locations on South Church Road for safe boarding/alighting between peak school operating hours.

Outside of peak school hours, these restrictions will provide additional unrestricted on-street parking space for residents of South Church Road on an evening and weekends.

Vehicles parked immediately on the junction restrict access, egress & visibility.





Durham County Council - Summary

Location 1 – Boddy Street – To introduce 'no waiting at any time' restrictions (double yellow lines) around the junction from Boddy Street into Tindale Crescent to address obstructive parking and improve access/egress.

Location 2 – King James - To improve the current arrangement of restrictions and introduce formalised coach parking bays (Monday-Saturday, 8am-6pm) on South Church Road to address accessibility issues and improve traffic flow around peak school times.

Location 3 – Etherley Lane/The Copse - To introduce 'no waiting at any time restrictions around the junction from Etherley Lane into the Copse to address obstructive parking associated with the car home and improve visibility for approaching road users.

Location 4 – St Andrew's Terrace - To introduce 'no waiting at any time' restrictions around the junctions from Deneside onto St Andrew's Terrace and from St Andrew's Road onto South Church Road to address obstructive parking, to improve traffic flow and access/egress.

Recommendation

Officers recommend that the Committee resolves to set aside the objection/s and endorse the proposal, in principle, which will then guide the Corporate Director in the exercise of delegated decision making.
