


Increase in overall number of CiC and rate is now above regional and statistical neighbour average


Just over a third of children have been in care for less than 12 months whilst around a quarter have been in care for over 5 years



## Initial Health Assessments




Around half of children in care received an Initial Health Assessment within 20 working days of coming into care in the quarter.




Review Health Assessments completed within timescale have also reduced – 47 out of timescale in Q2

### CLA placements by type and provision




A higher proportion of children in Durham are placed in foster placements and in in-house provision to our benchmarks.




Monthly decrease in volume of missing episodes and number of children in care with a missing episode since October, however this is typical in colder months




High rate of completion of return to home interviews (99%), however there has been a decline in December but this could be a recording issue










#### Accommodation suitability of 19-21 year olds (former relevant)


