Purpose of the Report

To consider a request for temporary traffic regulation by Order on 20/03/24 for the purpose of public safety and to allow for repair works on Crook Footpath 81 near Toronto.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Council exercises its powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 to effect a Temporary Traffic Regulation Order to facilitate the proposed works

Background

The footpath was closed on 28 February 2024 owing to severe surface scouring and will need to remain closed until repairs are undertaken to make it safe to use.

Options

Other traffic management arrangements have been considered and the most appropriate method is for temporary public closure for up to 6 months.

Recommendation

The recommendation is approved and that following, consultations with the Chief of Police, arrangements be made to progress the advertising of Public Notices and sealing of an Order.
