To consider a request for temporary traffic regulation to prohibit motor vehicular traffic and horse drawn vehicles by Order on 15 May 2024 for the purpose of settlement works on Byway 12, aka Yarm Lane, Sedgefield.

Background

Works have recently been undertaken to repair the byway following extensive damage by 4x4 vehicles and the area requires temporary restriction to allo for settlement and recovery.
