Description of decision	Durham City Regeneration Milburngate Development [Key Decision: REG/2024/005] - To provide Cabinet with an update on and proposals in relation to the Milburngate Development, Durham City.
Reasons why the meeting will be held in private	The press and public will be excluded from the meeting because the meeting will be considering a report that contains exempt information, as detailed below. 1. The report will contain exempt information which falls within paragraph 3 of part 1 of Schedule 12A to the Local Government Act 1972 (Information relating to the financial or business affairs of any particular person including the authority holding that information) and paragraph 5 of part 1 of Schedule 12A to the Local Government Act 1972 (Information in respect of which a claim to legal professional privilege could be maintained in legal proceedings), and 2. In relation to the exempt information, it has been determined that the public interest in maintaining the exemptions outweighs the public interest in disclosing the information because of the serious consequences for the authority and others if the information should come into the public domain.
