Key points – incident statistics (year ending Dec 23)


- FRSs attended **592,996 incidents in the year ending December 2023**, a 5.6% decrease compared with the previous year (**628,034**).
- Of these incidents, there were **142,276** fires, which was a 22% decrease compared with the previous year **(183,312)**.
- These decreases can be attributed to an 32% decrease in secondary fires and a 39% decrease in outdoor primary fires due to the hot, dry summer in 2022 which falls within the comparator year.





National Performance insights

Figure 1.1: Total incidents attended by incident type, England; the year ending December 2013 to the year ending December 2023



As figure 1.1 shows the share of incidents between incident types has changed over the past decade, with a greater share of incidents being non-fire incidents over recent years.

Total incidents in 2023 year ending December have decreased

Still the second highest year for all incidents since 2013 year ending December



Figure 5.1: Total fire-related fatalities, fires that resulted in at least one fatality and the percentage of fires that resulted in a fatality England; year ending December 2013 to year ending December 2023




Fire related fatalities have fluctuated over the last few years but risen from 238 to 257 from 2022 to 2023

As shown in figure 5.1, the percentage of primary fires that resulted in a fatality has ranged between 0.3% and just over 0.4% over the past 10 years. With the exception of the year ending December 2017, the ratio of fire-related fatalities and fires that resulted in at least one fatality has been relatively stable over the same period. There were 269 fire-related fatalities in the year ending December 2023, from 250 fires that resulted in at least one fatality.













0202 - Accidental dwelling fires per 100,000 pop by Fire service name











0306 - non-domestic property fires per 100,000 pop by Fire service name











