Purpose of the Report

- 1 To consider changes to the Public Rights of Way network.
- 2 Public Bridleway No. 33 Esh, proposed Diversion and Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order.

Executive summary

- 3 In the interests of the landowner it is proposed to divert part of Public Bridleway No. 33 Esh Parish.
- 4 Consultations on the proposed diversion have been carried out and no objections have been received.

Recommendation

- 5 The proposal is in accordance with the Council's policy and the statutory framework on the diversion of public rights of way.
- 6 It is RECOMMENDED that a Diversion and Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order be made under the provisions of the Highways Act 1980 and the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 to divert Public Bridleway No. 33 Esh Parish in the interests of the landowner, and the Order shall subsequently be either confirmed or referred to the Secretary of State for determination, and that the Corporate Director of Resources be informed accordingly.

Background

- 7 An application has been received from the landowner, the Hankey family, to divert part of Public Bridleway No. 33 Esh to use an existing farm track and move the bridleway away from the domestic property and from livestock areas, as shown on the attached plan.
- 8 Bridleway No. 33 runs in a generally southerly direction from Bridleway No.34 past Esh Hall, then easterly.
- 9 The proposal is to divert a section of Bridleway No. 33 onto a more easterly alignment, heading south from Bridleway No.34 on an existing track.
- 10 Consultations have been carried out with the Local Members, the Cabinet Portfolio Holder, Esh Parish Council, the Ramblers' Association, the British Horse Society and other user groups. No objections have been received.

Options

11 The proposal retains and protects public access at this location.

Conclusion

12 Agreed to the Diversion Order in accordance with the Recommendation.
