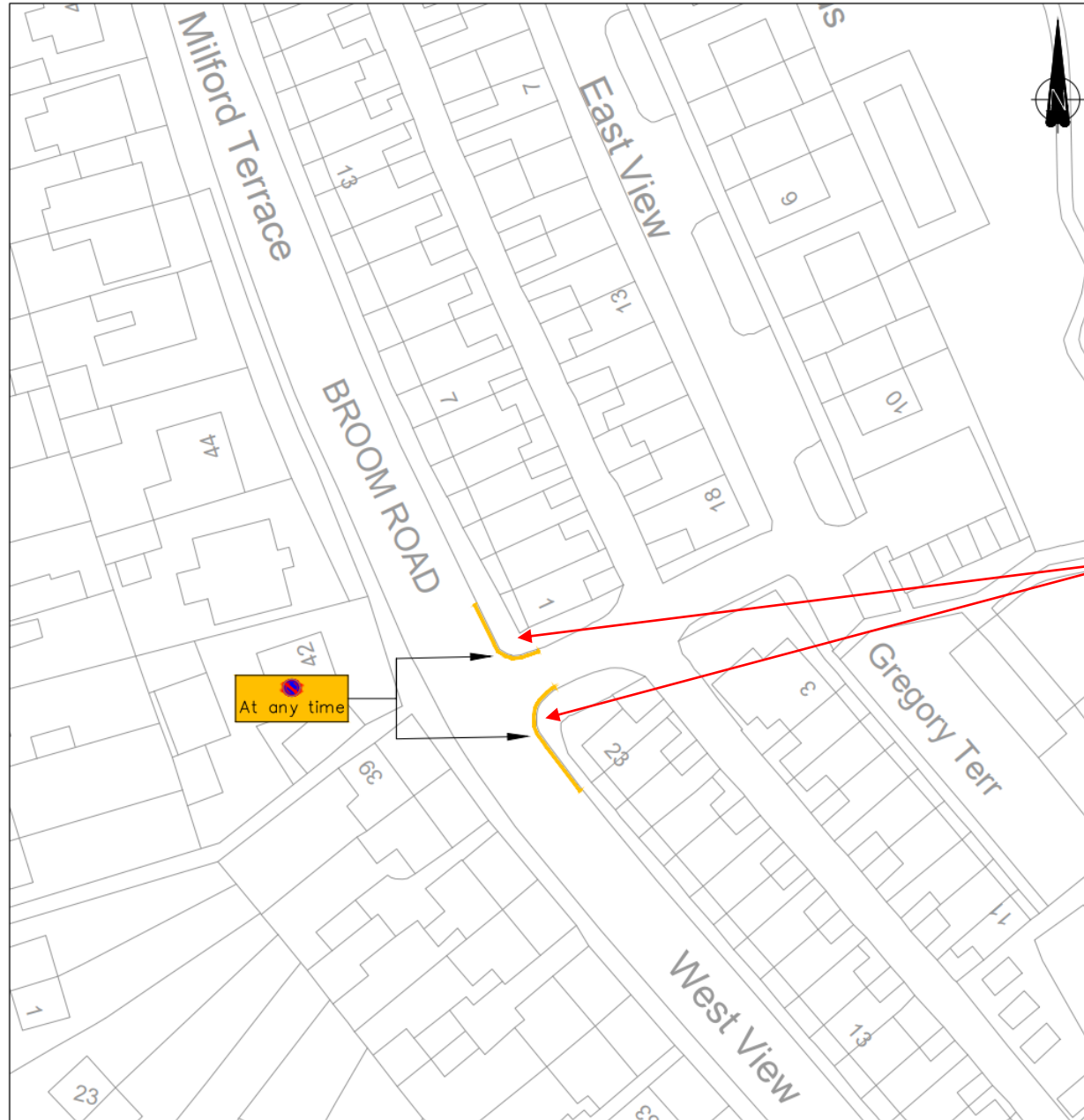

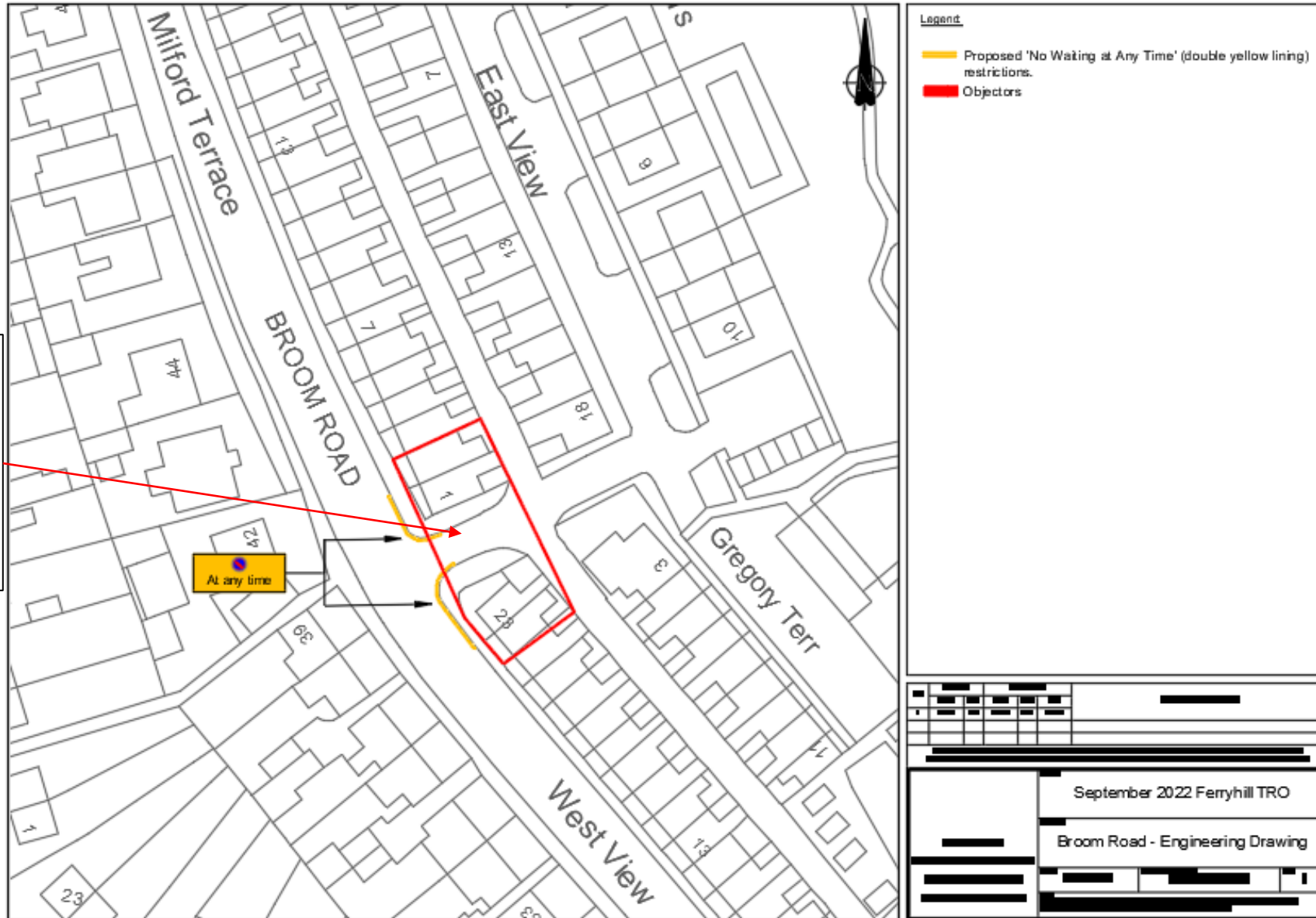

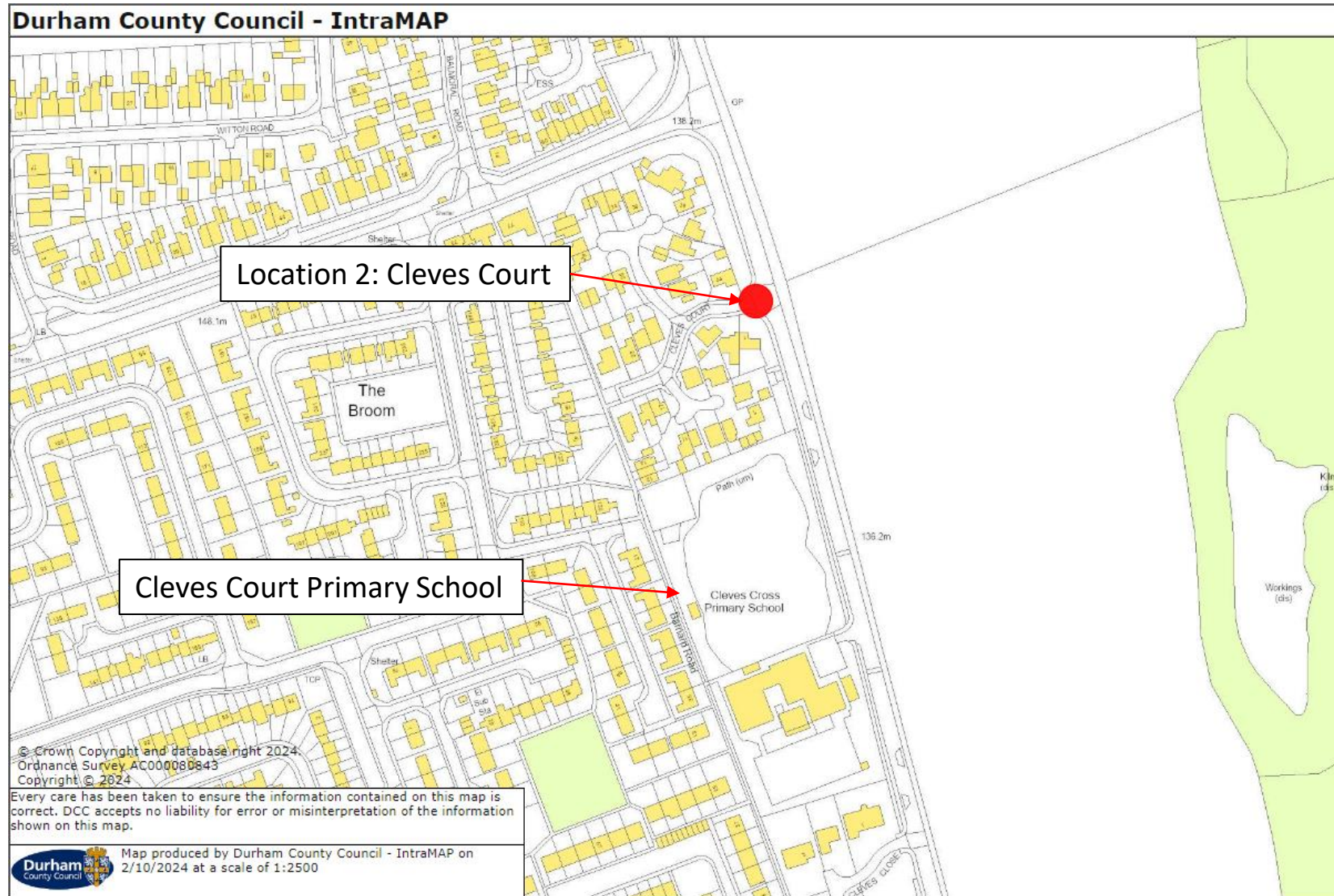

Vehicles parking around junction obstruct visibility when exiting Cleves Court.



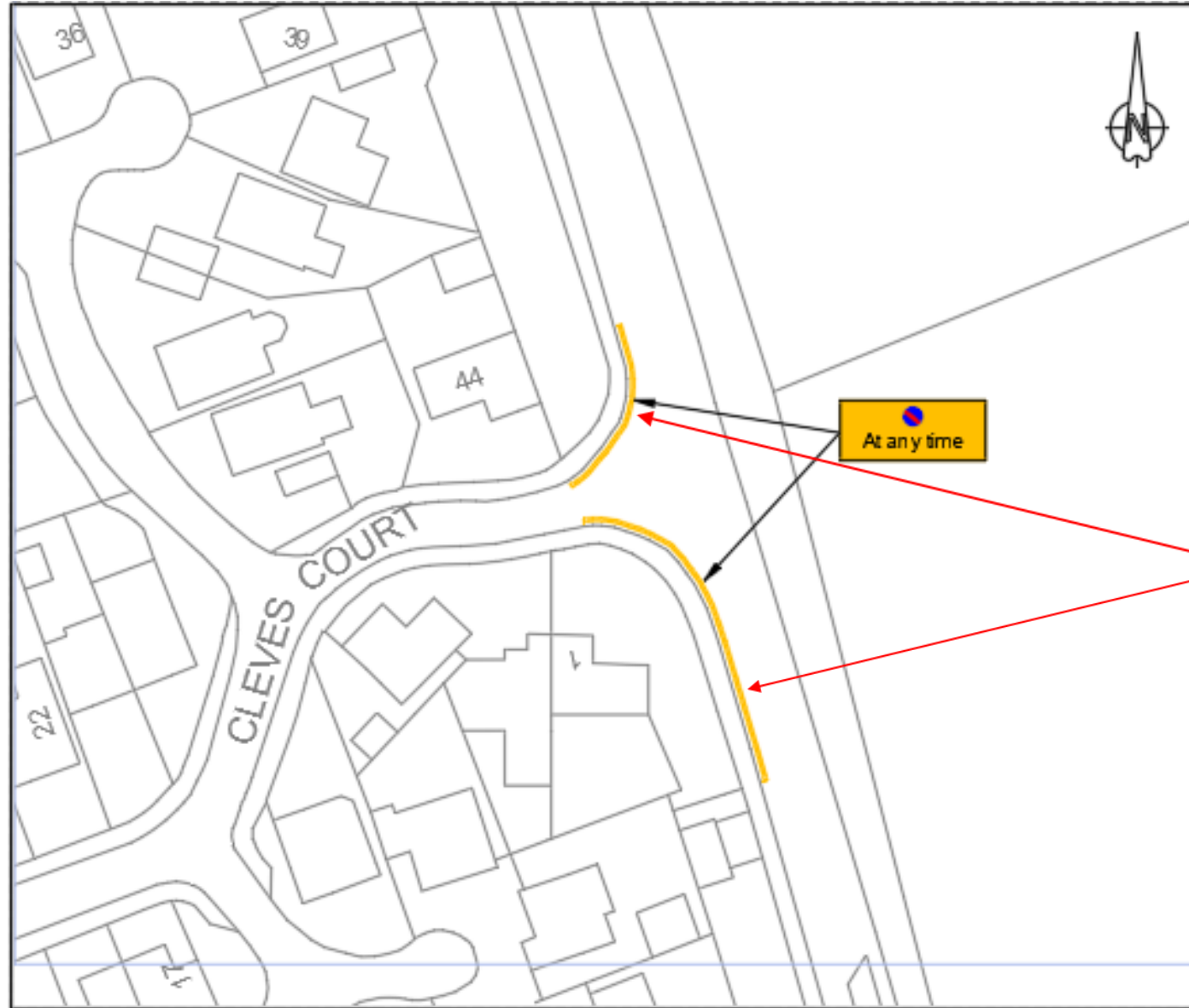

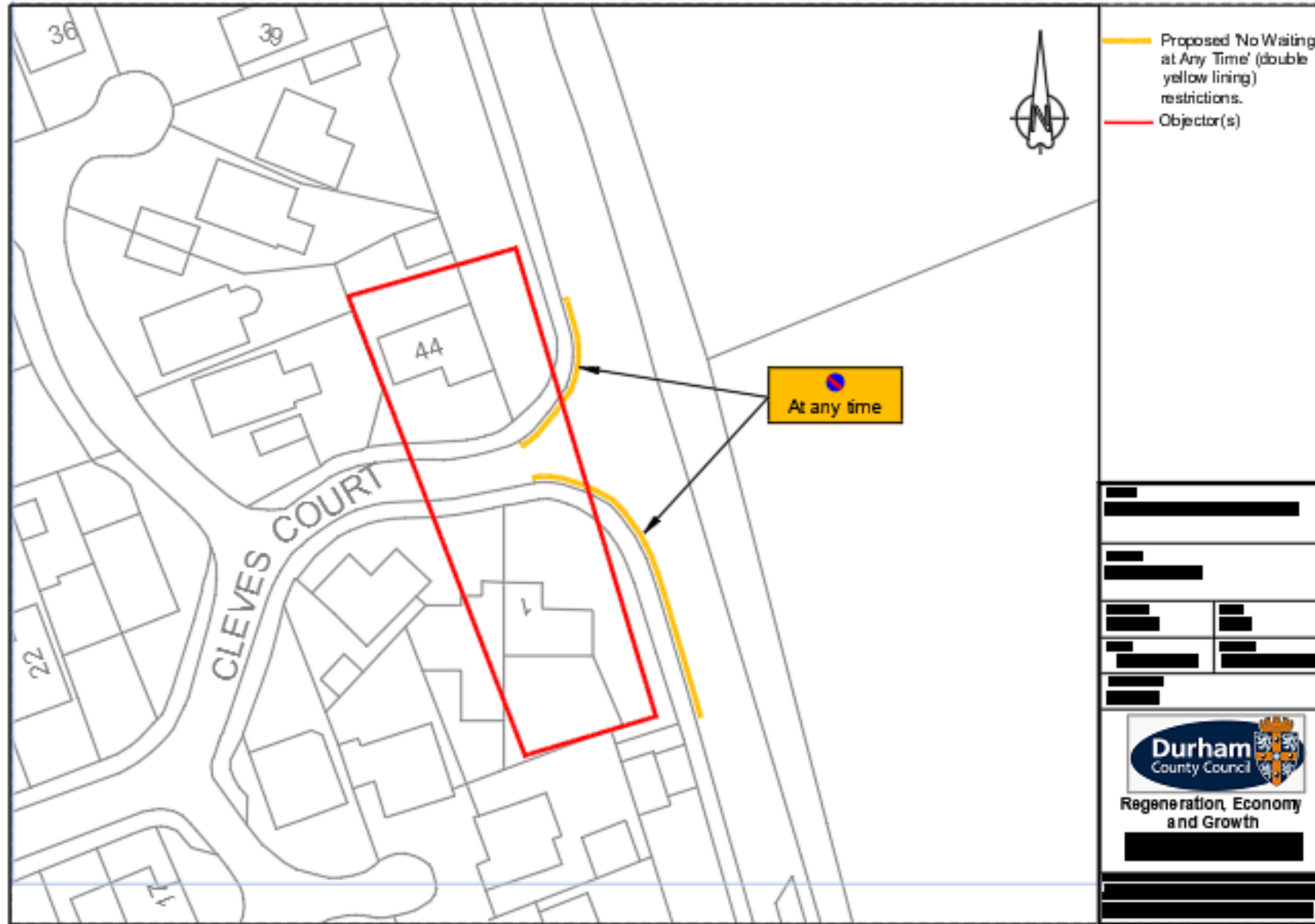
# Location 2 – Cleves Court - Proposals Locations

## Durham County Council - Summary

**Location 1 – Broom Road** – To introduce ‘no waiting at any time’ restrictions (double yellows) either side of the junction of Broom Road leading into Milford Terrace. The proposed is to improve visibility, road and pedestrian safety at peak school times.

**Location 2 – Cleves Cross** - To introduce ‘no waiting at any time’ restrictions (double yellows) either side of the junction of the C37 leading into Cleves Court. The proposed is to improve visibility, road and pedestrian safety at peak school times.

### **Recommendation**

Officers recommend that the Committee resolves to set aside the objection/s and endorse the proposal, in principle, which will then guide the Corporate Director in the exercise of delegated decision making.
