

Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General - all four licensing objectives (b, c, d, e) (please read guidance note 9) We promote good behaviour and extend goodwill and politeness, thus encouraging the same in return. We provide an efficient service in a clean environment which in turn we hope is appreciated by our customers. We discourage rowdiness at all times and where necessary point out to customers their responsibilities.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Point of sale will clearly state the law and premises policy that: Proof of age is required.ID accepted as a proof (passport, driving licence and an ID card carrying a pass logo). Where appropriate, the premises supervisor shall take part in Police led initiatives. The premises supervisor shall communicate with the Police to notify and report any incidents of crime and disorder as soon as practically possible. CCTV conforming to a minimum police standard will be in operation and good working order at all times that the premises are being used for licensable activities. Ensuring coverage of all public entrances, exits to the licensed premises, providing continuous recording facilities for each camera to a good standard of clarity and each positioned to the satisfaction of the Police. Recordings shall be retained (on tape, disc, hard drive or otherwise) for a period of 28 days. Recording shall be available at the reasonable request of the Police or Licensing Authority in writing 72 hours in advance.

Notices will be displayed at the entrances advising that CCTV is in operation. The premises supervisor will ensure all staff are trained and regularly reminded of their responsibilities in relation to the Licensing Law to ensure the detection and prevention of under-age sales.

c) Public safety

Requirement in regard to Health, Safety and Fire will be strictly taught and then adhered. Compliance with all reasonable requirements of the building control officer and fire officer.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

People congregating outside the premises will be actively discouraged. Consumption of alcohol will not be allowed on any part of the premises. The CCTV system will obviously help with that as a deterrent.

e) The protection of children from harm

The premises supervisor will ensure that all staff are trained in the importance of their responsibilities in ensuring that customers wishing to purchase alcohol are over 18 years of age, and that anyone who appears to be under 21 years of age and is attempting to purchase alcohol must be required to produce satisfactory photographic proof of age, which may include passport, driving licence or pass-card.

Management and staff will be vigilant at all times for the safety, welfare and supervision of minors.






