Purpose of the Report

1. To present for information to the Police and Crime Panel a letter from the Rt. Honourable Theresa May M.P., Home Secretary to Chief Constables titled 'Recording of Crime'.

Appendix 2 contains a letter dated 10th January 2014 from the Home Secretary to Chief Constables regarding the importance of accuracy to the recording of crimes so that statistics are as robust as the possibly can be. In addition, the letter also refers to the Public Administration Select Committee's inquiry into the accuracy of crime statistics and that following approval from the Home Secretary, Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Constabulary is to assess the quality of crime recording in every force and publish an update in April and a full report in Autumn.
