Public Footpath No 16 Sedgefield Parish, Proposed Diversion Order

Purpose of the Report

To consider changes to the Public Rights of Way network.

Public Footpath No. 16 Sedgefield Parish, proposed Diversion Order

Background

An application has been received from Story Homes to divert Public Footpath No 16 Sedgefield Parish, to enable the development of residential dwellings and associated infrastructure at land south of Eden Drive, Sedgefield, in accordance with planning permission granted in October 2016 following a Public Inquiry, as shown on the attached plan.

Footpath No.16 currently runs in a roughly north-westerly direction from the A689 across the development site. Full planning permission has been granted for the erection of eighty residential dwellings, affecting the area currently occupied by the footpath. As a consequence the applicant is seeking to divert the footpath to follow new footways, constructed to adoptable standard, within the development site. The proposal is to divert the south-eastern section of the footpath to a generally more southerly line. The Order is therefore necessary to enable development to proceed in accordance with granted planning permission.

Consultations have been carried out with the Local Members for Sedgefield, the Cabinet Portfolio Holder, the Town Council, the Ramblers' Association and other user groups. No objections have been received.

Details of any alternative options considered and rejected when making the decision

Retention of the footpath on its current alignment is not possible without preventing the implementation of the planning permission. This is the minimum diversion possible to enable the development to proceed whilst maintaining the integrity of the public rights of way network. The proposal retains and protects public access at this location.

Recommendations and reasons

The proposal is in accordance with the Council's policy and the statutory framework on the diversion of public rights of way. It is RECOMMENDED that a Diversion and Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order be made under the provisions of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 and the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 to divert Public Footpath No. 16 Sedgefield Parish, and the Order shall subsequently be either confirmed or referred to the Secretary of State for determination, and that the Corporate Director of Resources be informed accordingly, as per table 5, paragraph 5 of the Constitution of the County Council.
