I (Mrs Susan Gallimore, Senior Environmental Health Officer) formally notice the Licensing Authority that I withdraw my representation in relation to the premises licence application.

In pursuant to Regulation 9 of The Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 I give notice to the Authority that I consider a full hearing to be unnecessary and request that the Authority dispenses with such provided that any licence granted includes the following provisions or conditions in addition to any already put forward in the original application:

1. The Provision of Live Music, Provision of Recorded Music, Provision of Performances of Dance, Provision of Anything of a Similar Description to Live Music or Performances of Dance (Outside), be limited to 4 times per year.
2. Timings for the above are amended to be:

Provision of Live Music (Inside)

Monday to Sunday 10.00 to 23.00
Including Bank Holiday

Provision of Live Music, Provision of Recorded Music, Provision of Performances of Dance, Provision of Anything of a Similar Description to Live Music or Performances of Dance and Supply of Alcohol (Outside)

Monday to Saturday, including Bank Holidays 10.00 to 23.00
Sunday 10.00 to 22.30

3. The following additional conditions are agreed:
 - a) During periods of regulated entertainment a noise management plan shall be implemented for outdoor music events including those taking place in a tent. The noise management plan shall document and demonstrate how compliance with the Noise Council 1995 'Code of Practice on Environmental Noise Control at Concerts' will be achieved to minimise noise impact on residents of the surrounding area. The Noise Management Plan shall be submitted to the licensing authority for approval no later than 14 days prior to the first event each year.

- b) Where a music event is due to take place the licensee shall appoint a suitably qualified and experienced noise control consultant to the approval of the Licensing/Noise Regulatory Authority no later than six weeks prior to the event. The noise control consultant shall liaise between all parties including the Licensee, promotor, sound system supplier, sound engineer and the Licensing/Noise Regulatory Authority etc., on all matter relating to noise control prior to and during the event.
- c) A noise propagation test shall be undertaken at least two hours prior to the start of the event in order to set appropriate control limits at the sound mixer position. The sound system shall be configured and operated in a similar manner as intended for the event. The sound source used for the test shall be similar in character to the music likely to be produced during the event.
